# Press release

From June 30 to September 16, 2012, the MAC/VAL (Museum of Contemporary Art of the Val-de-Marne) is holding a special exhibition bringing together works by ten artists focusing on questions including: – How can the body be the focus of affirmation or resistance?

How does one find one's place in the world as an artist, and in a larger sense, as an individual?
How can artists position themselves as subjects in relation to the Other?

This summer, the MAC/VAL will explore these questions from the artist's perspective, reflecting upon mankind's environment, our construction of that environment in an increasingly homogenized world, and on the role of the artist. By coming to  $(48^{\circ}47'34" \text{ N} / 2^{\circ}23'14" \text{ E})$  (the geographical coordinates of the MAC/VAL, in Vitry-sur-Seine) visitors will be able to follow several circuits centered on these questions.

## Variations on « Situation(s) »

" This exhibition will bring together creations by ten artists whose work is based on a suspension of the differences between private and public spaces. Notions of identity and identities and self-representation will come into play through evolving, performative, and collaborative works. Between appearing and vanishing, camouflage and acrobatics, the works also address questions of community, visibility, gender, colonialism, centers and periphery ... questions of affirmation and situation, of positioning, coming and going, images, bodies ... Ultimately, the exhibition invites the public to reflect upon the place of art, the nature of art and the role of the artist.

Johanna Billing's You don't love me yet (2002- ....), collects covers of Rocky Erickson's eponymous song, articulating the singularity and collective dynamic that exists between difference and repetition. Jakob Gautel retraces the past of his ancestor in Maria Theodora (1862/63 and 1996/97), tracing her movement between Indonesia and Germany in the middle of the Nineteenth Century. In an excerpt from the series « Notre corps est une arme » (« Our body is a weapon »), Clarisse Hahn's Los Desnudos (2011) tells the story of Mexican farmers who created a new form of protest to denounce the theft of their lands. Since 1998, Matthieu Laurette has put together a subjective cartography of the world in from the point of view of his professional activity as an artist, regularly proclaiming, « I am an artist » Marcello Maloberti works to make visible the invisible part of the actions that bring people together and weave social ties in carnival and processions. Melanie Manchot disrupts established representations of the body by asking questions about body consciousness in private spheres and festive exchanges with Dance (All Night/Paris) [2012] whereas her Perfect Mountain (2011) addresses the problems of mass tourism. The postcolonial, feminist perspective of Aleksandra Mir's First Woman on the Moon (1999), re-evaluates the history of space exploration, and in doing so, the history of territorial expansion in general. Frédéric Nauczyciel's works scrutinize the hiding and representation of the body and masculine identities in hostile environments. His The Fire Flies, Francesca (Baltimore) (2011) provides an immersed and attentive perspective of the black queer community of Baltimore. Marylene Negro seeks to find a place within the constant flux news media imagery (Daymondes 2012) and paints a sort of collective, fugitive and fragmentary portrait with her Et maintenant: 06 21 58 43 67 (2012). Since 1995, Tsuneko Taniuchi has challenged feminine stereotypes and clichés in his « micro-events ». With the series « Mariages » (« Marriages »), begun in 2002, she redefines the social pact itself. »

During the exhibition « Situation(s) » the MAC/VAL will also run an interactive website. This free, collaborative and continually available space will be a prolongation and echo of the artists' works in the exhibition. The website's content, which will be both shareable and changeable, is made up of a database focused on the exhibitions themes.
